## 3.1. Immediate Actions (Next 2-4 weeks)

1. Apply workshop skills to a real project
  - Choose an existing analysis or report.
  - Convert it to Quarto format.
  - Implement one new feature learned.
2. Set up your publishing workflow
  - Choose primary platform (e.g., GitHub Pages, Netlify, etc.).
  - Configure automated deployment.
  - Test with a simple project.
3. Explore extensions relevant to your work
  - Browse the extension gallery.
  - Install 2-3 extensions that match your needs.
  - Experiment with their features.

## 3.2. Medium-term Goals (Next 1-6 months)

1. Develop organisational standards
  - Create branded theme/template.
  - Document style guidelines.
  - Share with colleagues.
2. Contribute to the community
  - Share your projects publicly.
  - Ask/answer questions in forums.
  - Consider writing blog posts about your experience.
3. Advance technical skills
  - Learn extension development.
  - Explore advanced formatting techniques.
  - Integrate with other tools in your workflow.

## 3.3. Long-term Development (6+ months)

1. Become a local champion
  - Present Quarto at meetups/conferences.
  - Mentor colleagues in adoption.
  - Lead internal training sessions.
2. Contribute to the ecosystem
  - Develop custom extensions.
  - Submit bug reports and feature requests.
  - Contribute to documentation.
3. Stay current with developments
  - Follow release notes and updates.
  - Participate in beta testing.
  - Engage with the development community.

## 4.1. When you encounter issues

1. Check documentation first
  - Official docs often have solutions.
2. Search existing discussions
  - GitHub Discussions.
  - GitHub Issues.
1. Create reproducible examples
  - Minimal example that demonstrates the issue.
  - Include system information.
  - Share relevant configuration files.
2. Post in appropriate forums
  - GitHub Discussions for general questions.
  - GitHub Issues for bugs.
